From the Walk with Me prayer book: "The word "Pentecost" comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth. It refers to a pattern of Jewish feasts. Pope Leo the Great makes important connections when he writes: "As once to the Hebrew people, freed from Egypt, the Law was given on Mt Sinai on the fiftieth day after the sacrifice of the lamb, so after the Passion of the Christ when the true Lamb of God was killed, on the fiftieth day from the Resurrection, the Holy Spirit came down on the apostles and the community of believers. For us as for the apostles, it means that God's love has been poured out, living and breathing within each one of us". Come Holy Spirit! God Bless. Fr David
